Hampshire County Council is now inviting eligible families to sign up to **free** school holiday clubs over the upcoming summer holidays, as part of the Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) programme.

For this summer, they require all children accessing benefitrelated free school meal (FSM) support to be registered with the council ahead of booking and attending schemes. By registering, you will receive a unique code that can be used to book places with any of our activity providers.

Support for Hampshire Households (Summer 2024)



General support: Current and previous Household Support Fund grant recipients can be found on the Support from community organisations webpage of the connect4communities website. The organisations listed on this page should be contacted directly for support.



Community pantries: Anyone can become a pantry member and receive discounted food for a small weekly fee (e.g. £5 membership for £15 worth of items). The list of pantries in each district is available on the *Community pantries* webpage on the connect4communities website and you will need to contact or visit the pantry directly to sign up.



Food vouchers: Households receiving Council Tax support are eligible for a one-off £25 food voucher and households receiving Housing Benefit support only can receive a one-off £40 voucher. These are distributed by local district and borough councils who will contact eligible households directly.



Holiday Activities and Food (HAF): While holiday meal vouchers have not been distributed since Easter 2022, the HAF programme continues to provide support to families by offering enriching activities and healthy meals to children aged 4-16 throughout the school holidays. Full information about HAF is available on the *Holiday Activities and Food Programme* webpage on the connect4communities website.



Discretionary funding for schools: Grants have been made available to all education settings in Hampshire to be used at their discretion to support families with items such as food vouchers and school uniforms. Families should contact their child's school directly to enquire if this discretionary funding can be used to support them. Further information is available on the Support for families with children webpage on the connect4communities website.



Utility support: The Environment Centre and Citizens Advice Hampshire both provide a range of helpful guidance with utility and fuel bills, and can signpost to other areas of support. For more information, please visit the Support with gas, electric and water bills webpage on the connect4communities website. If you are facing disconnection or can't top up your prepayment meter, contact your supplier immediately.



Housing support: Individuals should contact their local district or borough council's housing support units. Please visit the *GOV.uk* website for details on your local council's contact details.



Support for organisations: Community Grants, Advice Grants and Food Support Grants are available to voluntary organisations in Hampshire to help support local cost of living projects. For application open dates and further details, please visit the Applying for Household Support Fund community grants webpage on the connect4communities website.



Other targeted support: The following cohorts are eligible for fuel, food or supermarket vouchers: care leavers; post-16 young people in supported lodgings; families open to HCC's Disabled Children's Team; foster carers with a child in placement; SGOs or connected carers receiving financial support from HCC; families of children educated other than at school who have a social worker; looked after children placed at home; unaccompanied asylum-seeking children aged 16-18; disabled adults who are supported by Adult's Health and Care services; unpaid carers.
