Home visits

As a school, we have a duty to safeguard all children. With this in mind, if your child is absent and we do not have any contact from you, we will conduct a home visit. This will usually be completed before midday.

As part of these visits, we will ask to see the child and to talk to them with you about how they are feeling.

Please rest assured that this policy allows us to protect all children, without making any judgements. This will not be the case if you contact us about the absence, unless we have a further concern.

Restrict

Sometimes blocking or reporting someone doesn't feel right. Restrict empowers you to quietly protect your account from unwanted interactions.

You can Restrict by:

- Swiping left on a comment
- Using the **Privacy** tab in **Settings**
- Selecting the three dots on the user's profile

Once you have Restricted a user, their comments on your posts will only be visible to them. You can view their comments by tapping "See Comment", then approving, deleting, or ignoring them.

You will not receive their notifications and direct messages will go to Message Requests. If you read their messages, the Restricted user will not be able to see your online status or read receipts.

Instagram

Please remember that your child should not be on Instagram due to the age rating of this app. However, if you choose to allow your child on it, please make sure that you are taking all of the steps necessary to keep them safe.

Around 15% of children have stated that they do talk to strangers online does your child know why that's not safe?

Keep talking to your child about how to respond if something makes them feel uncomfortable. Remember: children report being made to feel uncomfortable more often by someone they know than someone they don't!

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about

Also known as Monkey Cool, this platform aims to fill the gap left by Omegle (which has now shut down) by placing users in random video chats with strangers. Participants use their mobile number and Snap chat username to connect to the service, where they can make matches, message other people and join group chats. The mobile version has been removed from the App Store due to safety concerns, but iPhone owners can still access the site via their web browser. The app remains available on Google Play, where its listing claims that Monkey has more than 30 million users worldwide.

DISCUSS THE DANGERS

Even if you're comfortable with your child using Mankey, it's still important to talk about the potential dangers. It's crucial, for instance, that young people recognise the risks that stem from video chatting with strangers; that they understand not to share identifying information (like their street or school name); and that they know what to do if they are exposed to inappropriate content.

REPORT INAPPROPRIATE CONTENT

Monkey states in the safety section of its site that "people are given the power" and that, to a large extent, Monkey is "self-governing," If a user is exposed to sexually explicit or inappropriate content on the platform, they can select the 'police' emoji in the top right corner of their screen to submit a report for Monkey's moderation team to review.

RESTRICT IN-APP PURCHASING

If your child is accessing Monkey via an Android device, you can prevent them from making in-app purchases through the device's settings. If you do allow your child to use the site, we'd recommend that you enable this feature: young people have been known to spend significant amounts of money in their desire to unlock more features in appr such as this

N Charles SPOT THE SIGNS

If you're concerned that your child is spending too much time on Monkey – or that they may have been exposed to inappropriate or distressing content – it's important to watch for potential indications that they've been affected emotionally. They could be unusually irritable or unable to concentrate, for example, or failing to complete their homework or even to eat regular meals.

School gate - safeguarding notice

The school gate will be opened by a member of school staff at 8:35am each morning and at 2:55pm each afternoon. Please do not come into the school grounds at drop-off and pick-up before these times.

At the end of each school day, there are children moving around the school site on their way back to their classrooms from assemblies. This is made much more difficult when parents have entered the school site early and are waiting in the playground. It can also pose a potential safeguarding risk.

If, for any reason, you need to come to school during the day, please ensure that you close all gates that you walk through. We regularly monitor the gates but need your cooperation to ensure the site is secure. Keeping children safe is everyone's responsibility
