

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A school day is 6 hours and 30 minutes long (from morning registration until the end of the day) meaning that, in a typical week, children spend 32.5 hours at school.


A typical day at Wellington Community Primary School consists of:

08:45 - Registration (to be completed by 08:50)

15:15 - Home time



What we want to achieve

Our aim is to ensure that the children experience a smooth transition from Y1 to Y2.

- The Year 2 curriculum extends the experiences that children have had in Year 1.
- We believe in providing children with a broad and well-balanced curriculum through a range of individual, small group and large group activities.

Attendance and Punctuality - legality

Children need to be in school every day and on time.

Face-to-face education is important in helping pupils to fulfil their potential.

During school time we believe pupils should be in class with their teachers and peers and enjoying all the benefits that brings.

Why is regular attendance so important?

Being in school every day that it is open is important to your child's achievement, wellbeing and their wider development.

<u>Evidence</u> shows that the students with the highest attendance throughout their time in school gain the best GCSE and A Level results.

Punctuality

If your child is consistently late, they may miss out on reading and may fall behind in their attainment. We start every day with reading and phonics lessons at Wellington so it is crucial they don't miss out on this learning.

It is also really hard for a child to walk in late to a full classroom that has already settled; they will miss out on the normal routines and time to adjust and find out about their day.

Attendance and Punctuality:

Parents or carers of a child have a legal responsibility to ensure their child receives a suitable education. This is usually achieved through regular attendance at school.

Maintained schools must only grant leaves of absence for specific circumstances and you must ask the school in advance. Leaves of absence will not be given for holidays and are VERY rarely given!

Rules around issuing fines for unauthorised absences

Penalty notices are designed to help ensure consistency across the country. Fines will increase to:

- •£80 to be paid within 21 days, or
- •£160 if paid after 21 days but within 28 days

School Uniform Expectations

ALL UNIFORM AND BAGS MUST BE CLEARLY NAMED

- · School jumper (worn or held, not tied around the waist)
- · White polo shirt always tucked in
- Black/grey trousers/skirt
- Black shoes (no coloured laces etc...)
- · Hair should be tied back if long
- · No nail varnish and stud earrings only
- · No other jewellery unless for religious reasons

(all jewellery must be removed for PE)

No rucksacks needed just a book bag and drawstring P.E bag.

Children should bring in their PE kit on a Monday and keep it in school all week.

Indoor PE kit should consist of: black shorts, white t-shirt and trainers.

In the colder months, children will need to wear tracksuit bottoms and their school sweatshirt as we often do PE outside.

Long hair should be tied back.

No jewellery.

For health and safety reasons, staff are not allowed to remove a child's earrings. This must be done either by the child or their carer beforehand.



House keeping and contacting us

- Water bottles these should be labelled and brought into school every day.
- No Nuts please be aware we are a nut free school & there are children with severe nut allergies.
- Birthdays packaged items only, no items that may contain nuts (we also have a number of vegetarian/halal children)
- Speaking to us our relationship with parents/carers is really important. The best way is to communicate is via email through the office with a reason why you need to speak to us and we will give you a call back or email as soon as we can! SLT are on the gate in the mornings and you can always talk to them as well.

BLUE GREEN YELLOW RED





















































































Reading

In school:

Daily reading journey lessons / phonics sessions



At home:

If the children are still on the RWI scheme, they will take home two decodable books a week (matching the colour they are on). If they are off the scheme, they will take a chapter/longer book home once a week or whenever they finish it.

We would really appreciate it if you could read with your child everyday (but a minimum of 3 times a week) and record this in your child's yellow reading record. Class teachers will monitor reading records to look for regular readers and to see who may need extra support at school.

Books and reading diaries need to be brought into school everyday as there will be opportunities throughout the school day where adults will read with the children.

The children's reading books will be changed on a weekly basis - this will usually be on a Monday.

Please sign the yellow reading record every time they read, whatever they read!


Maths
