Jobs and responsibilities September 2024

At Wellington we encourage our pupils to take on roles and responsibilities. We have a number of roles which children can take on to help develop their independence, confidence and resilience. These include:

Play Leaders: These students support during playtimes and lunchtimes - initiating positive play in the playground.

Librarians: Children who are passionate about reading often thrive in this role which includes supporting children in choosing new books and organising the library.

School Councillors: These students are chosen through a democratic election process and have real say in the school.

House Prefects: Available to Year 6 only. These students are role models for the rest of the school—there will be two for each house.

#### Cycling and Scooting to School



Please note that, if your child wants to cycle or scoot to school, we encourage this; however, they must ensure they are wearing a helmet and cannot cycle or scoot on school grounds.



All children need to be confident in their times tables and number facts they are the foundation of a huge amount of other learning. Your child's teacher will let them know if they need additional practice. Watch out for your child's TT Rockstars or NumBots log-in.



Attendance at school is vital in ensuring your child does not miss learning, as well as in building resilience. We will be working closely with you to ensure your child's attendance is above 97% as a minimum. This gives your child the best opportunity to achieve their full potential.

#### Uniform

At Wellington we take great pride in our appearance.

Our school uniform consists of:

- white shirt/polo shirt
- grey trousers, shorts, skirt or pinafore
- purple checked summer dress
- purple sweatshirt, fleece or cardigan
- smart black school shoes





Whilst branded uniform is not compulsory, this can be purchased by completing the order form on the school website or by contacting the school office.

Leggings are not school uniform.

### PE Kit

On days when your child has PE, they should come to school in their normal school uniform with their PE kit in a bag.

#### Our PE kit consists of:

- a plain white polo shirt or t-shirt
- black shorts
- socks
- trainers or plimsolls

In the colder months, children will need to wear tracksuit bottoms and their school sweatshirt as we often do PE outside, even if the weather is a little cooler.
