Quick Reminders

Here are a few helpful reminders to keep things running smoothly this term:



School timings - Classroom doors open at 8:40am and school finishes at 3:15pm. If you arrive after 8:50am, please sign in at the school office.

Attendance & punctuality - Every day in school matters! A consistent routine helps children feel secure, make progress and build friendships.

PE days - PE takes place on **Tuesday and Thursday**. Kits should be brought in on a Monday and sent home on Thursday to be washed. Please label all clothing clearly. As the weather cools, jogging bottoms and school jumpers are suitable for outdoor sessions.

Phonics and Reading at Home


In Year 1, phonics and reading are at the heart of everything we do. Every child is making great progress with their Read Write Inc sessions — thank you for supporting this at home.

Here's how you can make the most of reading time:

- Read with your child at least three times a week (a little every day is even better).
- Practise the sounds and "red words" that come home in their phonics books.

- Encourage your child to talk about what they've read "What happened?" "Who was your favourite character?"
- Record all home reading in your child's reading record.

Your encouragement at home makes a huge difference. Just 10 minutes of daily reading builds vocabulary, confidence and imagination — and it's one of the best ways to help your child succeed.



Online Safety: Making Good Choices Online

As children grow in confidence with technology, it's never too early to build good online habits. Through our computing curriculum, we teach our children about "Being Kind and Smart Online" — learning to make safe, respectful choices when watching, playing or exploring online.

At home, you can help by:

- Watching or playing alongside your child and talking about what they enjoy.
- Using child-friendly platforms such as YouTube Kids or CBBC iPlayer instead of unrestricted video sites.
- Reminding them: "If something makes you feel worried or confused online, tell a grown-up straight away."
- Using the BBC Own It website for simple, child-friendly advice about online life: www.bbc.com/ownit

Together, we can help children develop safe and positive online habits that will last a lifetime.
