School Timings

Just a quick reminder that the school gate opens at 8:35am, the classroom doors open at 8:40am and school finishes at 3:15pm. If you arrive after 8:50am, please take your child to the school office first - thank you.



Physical Education and Games

P.E will be on a Tuesday and Thursday this term.

P.E. kits should be brought into school with children and they will be getting changed at school. Tracksuit bottoms or shorts are preferable for this time of year as some of our PE lessons will take place outside. Appropriate footwear is essential such as plain black or white trainers or plimsolls. Please make sure children do not wear jewellery to school on these days, and have a hair band/bobble to tie their hair back, for health and safety purposes.

Home Learning

Homework will be set weekly on Numbots; it will be monitored weekly and there is an expectation of a minimum of 50 minutes. The tasks set will relate specifically to what your child is learning in class that week so they can consolidate their skills further at home and for you to have a greater understanding of what your child is doing each week.

Also, children will be set spellings on a Monday and will participate in a weekly spelling test to check their progress. You should practise these at home to embed their spelling knowledge.

Phonics

A key focus in year 1 is ensuring all children are able to recognise, say and blend sounds. We teach this through the Read Write INC programme. It is part of our school policy that you read with your child a minimum of 3x a week at home. All home reading should be recorded in your child's reading record and signed by an adult.

We are continuing to visit the library, but this will now be on a **Tuesday** afternoon. Please make sure their library book is in their book bag every **Tuesday** to ensure they get changed.

Despite only being 5/6 years old, we all have to be aware of online safety. Please carefully consider what your children may be able to access on unrestricted devices and online communications on games or websites. Online safety is an important part of our curriculum and we recommend talking about online safety regularly and openly.
