A warm welcome back to school; we hope you all have had a lovely summer break. We would like to take this opportunity to thank your children for making such a positive start to the new academic year. We are very proud of their efforts in the first week back and extremely excited for our learning journey to get underway. While we settle back into school life, we want you to know that we will, as always, do our very best to ensure your child is supported every step along the way.



Physical Education

Home Learning


Home learning plays an important role in bridging the relationship between home and school. Children will be expected to practise weekly spellings at home. These will be given to the children on a **Friday** and stuck into their reading records. The children will then have a short spelling test on the following **Friday**. This means it is important that **reading records are in school every day**. We thank you for your support with this.

We will also be providing children's NumBots login details and a parent information letter, so that you can support your child at home with accessing this learning tool. We recommend a 'little and often' approach - 3 minutes practice a day, 4 times a week is a good target.

Phonics and reading

Regular reading at home will support your child in all areas of their learning. A key focus in year 2 is ensuring all children are able to recognise, say and blend sounds. We teach this through the Read Write Inc programme. Once this program is completed, the children will move onto daily 'Reading Journey' lessons where they will read and comprehend whole books and complete tasks that develop their fluency and comprehension. Children will be sent home with a reading book each week - we recommend that this book is kept in children's bags so that it can be swapped when necessary. It is important you practise the sounds found in your child's Read Write Inc books as well as reading together. Children who have moved out of the Read Write Inc programme will come home with a reading book appropriate for their age and reading level.

Children should be reading a minimum of 3 times a week and all reading should be recorded in your child's yellow reading record. Please sign or initial your child's reading record to acknowledge their efforts. Books and reading records are expected to be in school every day. Children will also have the opportunity to check out additional books from our library. Our library day is a **Thursday**; the children need to have their library book in school if they wish to change it.

Online Safety

Although the children are currently in Year 2 and won't have their own phones, it's important for parents to be aware of the school's expectations regarding mobile phone use as they move through the school.

We are increasingly concerned about the impact of smartphones on our children, in-line with many other schools in Hampshire. Acknowledging the alarming amount of evidence and research about the negative effects of smartphones and social media, we are committing to making Hampshire



primary schools smartphone free. Please note that your child will not be permitted to have a smartphone in school, regardless of their transport home. "Brick" phones without internet connectivity may be accepted on a case-by-case basis. In addition, we ask for your support in making the school mobile phone free in general. Thank you for your support in this.
