Physical Education

At home, you can help by:

Talking regularly about what your child enjoys online and who they might be chatting to (even in games).

Using BBC Own It and Childnet for fun videos and games that teach safe online habits. Encouraging "tech-free times" — for example, no devices during dinner or before bed.

Setting up devices with child-safe settings and age-appropriate content filters.
