Welcome back to a new year! We hope that you had a lovely Christmas break and that you are ready for another fun-filled term at school. The children have returned to school full of enthusiasm and excitement at seeing their friends and finding out about our new topics. This half-term, we are thrilled to introduce our new history unit on the Tudors. As well as history, our art topic, focused on manga graphic art, will also have a Tudor theme to it. In science, we will be looking at forces and investigating their effect on certain objects. Computing will see us explore 'if, else' statements, with the intended outcome of creating a quiz with multiple questions. Here's to a fantastic half term!

## Physical Education and Games

Due to swimming this term, we will have one P.E. session per week which will be on a **Friday**. Please ensure that your child's PE kit is in from Monday as these days may change at short notice. For the first half term, Tigers will be swimming every **Thursday** so please ensure your child has their swimming bag in school. **Meerkats will be swimming after half term.**

As the weather is becoming colder, tracksuits bottoms and your child's school jumper are suitable for outdoor games. Appropriate footwear is essential. Please make sure children do not wear jewellery to school on these days and that they have a hair band/bobble to tie their hair back, for health and safety purposes.



## Home Learning

We have reviewed our homework provision across the Federation. Whilst homework can be an important tool in helping children with their learning, we realise that it needs to be purposeful and engaging. Therefore, we have made revisions to the homework that will be set going forward.

**Reading:** 3x weekly (minimum) - recorded in reading records (see below for more details).

**Spellings:** learn 5 spelling words. These will be set by the teacher on Mondays and weekly tests on Fridays to check and address gaps.

**Maths:** Times Tables Rockstars - 'little and often' throughout the week (roughly 10 minutes per day), aim for an hour over the week.

## Reading



Regular reading will support your child in all areas of their learning. In Year 5, we want to inspire a love and enjoyment of reading. Their book should encourage them to ask questions, wonder and express opinions as well as expanding their vocabulary and knowledge. Children must be reading at least **three** times a week for **20 minutes**, which needs to be recorded in their reading record alongside an adult comment or signature. Reading records will be collected **every Friday** to check if they are able to move up our reading challenge wall!
