Welcome to Year 6!

Welcome back to Wellington as our new Year 6! We hope a lovely summer break was had by all! We have had a fantastic first few days in our new classrooms and year group - already beginning (and enjoying!) our learning journey together. We have an exciting curriculum planned for the year ahead of us where we will be exploring topics including: Titanic, Frida Kahlo, Light and, of course, we will be making our own fairground rides in D.T.!

Curriculum Overview

They are very useful and will give you a greater idea of what your child is doing at school and how you can support and enhance their learning at home.



School Timings

Just a quick reminder that the school gates will be opened at 8:35am and our external classroom doors will open at 8:40am. School finishes at 3:15pm. If your child arrives after 8:50am, please bring/send them to the school office first - thank you.

Attendance and Punctuality

Children need to be in school every day and on time. Face-to-face education is important in helping pupils to fulfil their potential. During school time, pupils should be in class with their teachers and peers and enjoying all the benefits that this brings.

Physical Education

P.E. will be on **Wednesday**s for the first half-term. P.E kits should be brought in on a **Monday** and will be sent home on **Friday** to be washed.

As the weather is becoming colder, tracksuits bottoms and your child's school jumper are suitable for outdoor games. Appropriate footwear is essential. Please make sure children do not wear jewellery to school on these days





and that they have a hair band/bobble to tie their hair back, for health and safety purposes.

Home Learning

Home learning plays an important role in bridging the relationship between home and school. Children will be expected to complete the following home learning each week:

Reading: 3x weekly (minimum) - recorded in reading records (see below for more details).

Spellings: learn 5 spelling words. These will be set by the teacher on **Mondays** and weekly tests on **Fridays** to check and address gaps.

Maths: Times Table Rockstars - 'little and often' throughout the week (roughly 10 minutes per day), aim for an hour over the week.

We thank you for your support with this.

Reading

Regular reading will support your child in all areas of their learning. In Year 6, we want to inspire a love and enjoyment of reading. Their book should encourage them to ask questions, wonder and express opinions as well as expanding their vocabulary and knowledge. Children must be reading at least **three** times a week for **20 minutes**, which needs to be recorded in their reading record alongside an adult comment or signature. Reading records will be collected **every Friday** to check if they are able to move up our reading challenge wall!



Online Safety

We are increasingly concerned about the impact of smartphones on our children, in-line with many other schools in Hampshire. Acknowledging the alarming amount of evidence and research about the negative effects of smartphones and social media, we are committing to making Hampshire primary schools smartphone free. Please note that your child will not be permitted to have a smartphone in school, regardless of their transport home. "Brick" phones without internet connectivity may be accepted on a case-by-case basis. In addition, we ask for your support in making the school mobile phone free in general. Thank you for your support in this.

Uniform Expectations

Earrings: These should be single studs only. Your child will be asked to remove them or you will be asked to remove them if they wear other earrings. Children cannot wear earrings for PE as this is a health and safety issue.

Bracelets/ other jewellery: Please ensure that your child is not wearing other forms of jewellery. These are not safe to wear in school and your child will be asked to remove them.
