This will be an action packed half term that will go so quickly! With Sports Day, our trip, and the final Stay and Play of the year, we have much to achieve and celebrate.




Curriculum Overview

English	We use stories we have heard in our play, acting out characters in role.

	We can read words using at least 10 "Special Friends" independently.

Maths	We have developed a deep understanding of number to 10 including the composition of	
	each number.	
	We can subitise (recognise quantities without counting) up to 5.	
	We can automatically recall (without reference to rhyme, counting or other aids),	
	number bonds to up to 5 (including subtraction facts).	
	We can recall number bonds to 10, including double facts.	
	We can verbally count beyond 20.	
	We can recognise the pattern of the counting system.	
	We can compare quantities up to 10 in different contexts, recognising when one	
	quantity is greater than, less than or the same as the other quantity.	
	We can explore and represent patterns within numbers up to 10 including evens and	
	odds, double facts and how quantities can be distributed equally.	
	We can purposefully choose 2D shapes to make 3D models, for example, triangles and	
	rectangles to make a tent.	
	We can compare and order a range of objects by their size, length, weight or capacity.	
	We can use positional and directional vocabulary themselves to describe positions and	
Danganal Social	movements, for example, in, on, under, forwards, backwards to give directions to others. We are learning to be resilient and can try new things.	
Personal, Social and Emotional	We are exploring changes in myself and in others.
